


CERTIFICATE IN PIONEER MISSION AT THE NORTHERN MISSION CENTRE

*An introduction to Pioneer Mission:
equipping, enthusing and enabling
mission thinking and practice.*



Who is the Course for?

The newly arrived Certificate in Pioneer Mission course is for you if you are:

- Pioneering something
- Looking to develop your understanding of pioneer mission
- Excited by the idea of sharing ideas and experience with other pioneers
- Looking for an opportunity to study pioneer mission locally
- Able to commit to six weekends and six evenings for one year, as well as some independent study time.

The course is open to people with wide a range of learning preferences and previous experience. Sessions will be led in a variety of styles and will be accessible to those with learning difficulties, whilst ensuring a level of challenge in terms of content and ideas.

Come and See

We're running a Taster Day on July 11, 1.30 – 4.30 in Penrith or Online (as conditions allow).

You'll have an opportunity to meet some tutors and get a feel for the course.

What will I learn?

There are six modules which make up the course:

- What is Pioneer Mission?
- Reflective Practice in Context
- Reading the Bible in Context
- The Church in Mission
- Missional Leadership
- Mission Enterprise

Between modules you will meet up with others on the course for an evening hosted by a practising pioneer who will facilitate a discussion around the module themes.



Why train with the Northern Centre?

As a partnership between God for All and the Church Mission Society, we are able to offer an authentically northern pioneer approach embedded in practice.

With over 112 fresh expressions in Cumbria, we are widely recognised as leading the way in innovative mission and pioneer practice.

Penrith is strategically positioned to be accessible to the majority of the population in the North of England and South of Scotland.

Penrith is on a mainline railway and is within a two hour journey of Newcastle, Durham, Manchester, Glasgow, Bradford and Liverpool.

How does the course work?

The course will be delivered through the Northern Mission Centre – a partnership between the God for All team and the Church Mission Society.

Course leaders are experienced practitioners as well as established speakers and writers on pioneer mission.

Modules will run at Church House in Penrith, in Cumbria. As a county we have been identified as a Pioneer Hotspot. This context means that students have lots of opportunities to gain first hand experience of pioneer opportunities.

The cost of the course is £600 for those outside Cumbria and £300 for Cumbria residents. Please do get in touch if this fee would be an issue for you.

The course will run on Saturdays and Sundays on the following dates:

- 12/13 September 2020
- 3/4 October 2020
- 14/15 November 2020
- 6/7 Feb 2021
- 24/25 April 2021
- 12/13 June 2021

We are excited to be able to run the weekends online while that is considered necessary.

If overnight accommodation in Penrith is required, we are able to link you with local church hosts.
